


CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY AT OIL 2019-20

Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) of Oil India Limited (OIL) is governed by its Social Vision "OIL is a Responsible Corporate Citizen deeply committed to socio-economic development in its areas of operation", its policies on CSR and Sustainable Development, the DPE Guidelines, 2013, on CSR & Sustainability for the CPSEs; and the Companies Act, 2013 which came into effect from 1st April, 2014. (Read OIL's CSR & SD Policy here)

As specified under Schedule VII of the Companies Act, 2013, OIL's CSR projects and programmes are focused on several **key thrust areas** such as **Healthcare**, **Drinking Water & Sanitation**, **Education**, **Sustainable Livelihood**, **Capacity Building and Empowerment of Women**, **Skill Development**, **Rural Sports**, **Environment Sustainability**, **Augmentation of Rural Infrastructure**, **etc.** The CSR initiatives are implemented primarily in the operational areas of the Company in Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram, Rajasthan and Andhra Pradesh.

As per Section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013, every company, private limited or public limited, which either has a net worth of Rs 500 crore or a turnover of Rs 1,000 crore or net profit of Rs 5 crore, needs to spend at least 2% of its average net profit for the immediately preceding three financial years on Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives. OIL has been spending over 2% of the Average Net Profit of three preceding financial years on its CSR initiatives.

<u>Details of major CSR Projects undertaken by OIL under the key thrust areas defined</u> <u>under the Companies Act 2013, are as follows:</u>

HEALTHCARE & SANITATION -

Point No.(i) as per schedule VII of Companies Act, 2013

1. **Project** *SPARSHA*- **The Mobile Dispensary Services** is one of the most significant & foremost community welfare projects of the Company. Started in the early eighties, with the help of inhouse doctors and paramedics of OIL in Dibrugarh district. The project now covers OIL's operational areas in Dibrugrah Tinsukia and Charaideo districts in Assam and Changlang District in Arunachal Pradesh. The project caters to the primary heralthcare needs of the people in Remote areas of OIL's operational district is being implements in association with Piramal Swasthya.



The Mobile health care primarily extends the following services:

- Clinically diagnosing and treating select non-communicable diseases, chronic diseases and common diseases /ailments.
- Conduct health check-ups, lab tests/lipid profiling and dispensing medicines free of cost to the beneficiaries as deemed necessary via valid prescriptions provided by competent Medical Professionals (Doctors) supported by Nurses & Paramedics.
- Provide awareness on lifestyle diseases and special flood relief camps.

2. **Project 'AAROGYA'** – Based on the baseline survey carried out by WEBCON, Kolkata to identify the areas with higher incidence of Maternal Mortality Rate (MMR) and Infant Mortality rates (IMR), Project AAROGYA was initiated with an umbrella focus on reduction of MMR & IMR in and around OIL's operational areas of Tinsukia & Dibrugarh districts in the state of Assam. The project is currently being implements in 20 villages in Tinsukia and Dibrugarh.



The project in its current scope includes pre & post-natal health check-ups, sensitizing women on maternal, child health and benefits of institutional delivery,

tracking and counselling of pregnant women, immunization of babies and pregnant women, training in and awareness on first aid, community health for better health & hygiene, sanitation and family planning with focus on menstrual health & hygiene management.

Hands on training is provided to village women to equip them with required knowledge and skill on balanced dietary requirement at different periods of life according to age and gender leading to decline in IMR and MMR. Community training and awareness on better health, hygiene and sanitation practices are carried out using IEC tools.

OIL AAROGYA in association with WASH-UNICEF had conducted several awareness programs in the villages of Tinsukia & Dibrugarh district. The project's extended network of Saathiya Clubs has been one of the primary sources of percolation, through which information on health seeking behaviour and maintaining personal hygiene were promoted throughout the year.



SWACHH BHARAT ABHIYAN

In FY 2014-15 to FY 2016-17

- Construction of 1471 toilets for boys & girls in Government Schools in 7 (seven) districts of Dibrugarh, Tinsukia, Jorhat, Sivasagar, Barpeta, Bongaigaon and Dhubri.
- Installation of 20 nos. of RO/UV drinking water plants in villages of East Godavari District, in OIL operational area of KG Basin Project.
- Construction of 2 nos. of toilets for men & women in Ranau and Ramgarh villages of Jaisalmer district, in operational area of Rajasthan Project.
- Cleaning and maintenance of Bondajan water body under OIL's Pipeline Headquarters, at Narangi, Guwahati.
- Provided 2 nos. of garbage disposal trucks & 1000 nos. of garbage bins to Guwahati Municipal Corporation for garbage collection and cleanliness in different locations of Guwahati, (taken up in two phases).
- OIL constructed Toilet at Moitripur LP School, Diyun, Arunachal Pradesh, and Toilet at Digboi Unnayan Samity and Toilet facility at OILTownship in 7 nos. of locations for public use. Additionally, OIL took up a toilet utilization assessment survey of the already constructed toilets in various schools.
- OIL has adopted Kamakhya Temple, Guwahati under Swachh Iconic place initiative as a part of Swachh Bharat Mission apart from organizing Swachh Bharat Pakhwada, walkathons and seminars on Cleanliness in all its areas of Operations.

IN FY 2017-18,

- OIL has provided an amount of Rs 1.80 Crore towards construction of 1,500 toilets in Dibrugarh district to make the district "open defecation free" in addition to construction of toilets at 10 satras of Majuli under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. Apart from the above, following initiatives are taken by OIL:
- Providing financial assistance for an amount of Rs 1.07 crore towards maintenance of 1471 school toilets constructed under Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan in FY 2014-15, was disbursed to the concerned authority.
- Providing financial assistance towards development and beautification of Tinsukia Town including beautification of Morut Nanadan Kanon Park.
- Swachh Bharat Pakhwada at various levels including walkathons, initiatives like clean your
 work place through shramdaan, and seminars on Cleanliness etc were organized in all its
 areas of Operations.

IN FY 2018-19,

- Financial assistance for an amount of Rs 84.59 lakhs towards maintenance of 1471 school toilets constructed under Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan in FY 2014-15, was disbursed to the concerned authority.
- Toilets were constructed in various Government Schools in Dhubri and Goalpara Aspirational Districts of Assam and Namsai in Arunachal Pradesh.
- Household toilets were constructed in OIL's operational area in KG Basin, Andhra Pradesh.
- Swachh Bharat Pakhwada at various levels including walkathons, initiatives like shramdaan
 for swachhta, and seminars on Cleanliness etc were organized to raise awareness among the
 employees and the community to maintain cleanliness and hygiene in all its areas of
 Operations.

IN FY 2019-20

- Expenditure of Rs. 3.75 crore incurred on development of Swachh Iconic Place- Kamakhya Devi Temple
- Maintenance of school toilets for 5 years (1471 nos.) constructed by OIL under Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan in seven (7) districts in Assam

- Toilets were constructed across OIL's spheres including those in Schools, Individual Household Latrines and Community Toilets. Expenditure of Rs 3.67 Crore was incurred.
- Integrated Solid Waste Management system (ISWM) in operational areas by providing Waste Collection vehicle and other similar resources to the respective Municipal Authorities.
- Provision of Clean drinking water and toilets facilities in Government schools of Aspirational Districts viz Dhubri & Goalpara in Assam and Namsai in Arunachal Pradesh.
- Swachhta Pakhwada was organized across sphere to raise awareness on Swachhta Practices and reduce usage of single use plastic. Employees from all spheres of OIL participated in the programmes beside engaging communities from OIL's operational areas. Various events like Swachhta Shramdaan, Walkathon, Cycle Rallies, Street Plays, distribution of Jute bags, hygiene kits etc were conducted under the programme.

EDUCATION

point No. (ii) as per schedule VII of Companies Act, 2013

1. OIL Super 30: OIL India Super 30 which started in July 2010, is a completely free residential coaching for the meritorious students from the backward sections of the society hailing from Assam, Arunachal Pradesh & Rajasthan. The basic concept of the program is to keep the students focused and develop a result-oriented approach in preparing for the JEE Mains/Advance, other Engineering and Medical entrance examinations. The students are provided with free food, boarding and coaching for eleven



months starting from July to May (of each year). Residential coaching is provided to underprivileged students at six centres of Guwahati, Jorhat, Dibrugarh, Nagaon, Jodhpur and Itanagar with a capacity of 30 in each of the centres. Since, FY 2018-19, in view of growing interest of students towards Medical Entrance Examinations and as part of need based new initiative, a new batch of students were inducted at the Jorhat Centre.

2. **Project Dikhya:** Project Dikhya encapsulate various initiatives aimed at improving the school enrollment and literacy in the region and containing dropout through various technology and non-technology based interventions for students, teachers and elderly providing innovative teaching and learning methodologies.

Among various interventions under Project DIKHYA, some prominent initiatives are:

a) Computer & Value added Education in 30 schools

Based on the baseline survey and need assessment study was carried out by WEBCON, Kolkata, Computer & Value Added Education is imparted to the students of rural schools from OIL operational districts of Tinsukia, Dibrugarh and Charaideo. With the objective of promoting computer education in schools, started in 2012-13, the project has matured itself into a holistic education project with multipronged interventions impacting students and teachers of rural schools of Upper Assam. Under the project, custom designed buses with child friendly ambience are used to teach students of class VI, VII and VIII in 30 model schools. The project is implemented by Schoolnet India Ltd.

b) Smart Classroom (Knowledge-Yan & K-Class) in 305 schools

K-Yans are all-in-one educational device with high end computer, advanced projection system, in built interactivity with image processing technology, DVD player and inbuilt audio system. 300 such devices are distributed to the rural schools in Dibrugarh, Tinsukia and Charaideo districts in Assam and 5 (five) to 5 schools in Longding District, Arunachal Pradesh. Also, refresher trainings are provided to the teachers and senior



students of the school at regular intervals apart from other post installation services. Over the years, the K-Yan with multi-lingual course module helped around **4,65,000 students** to understand difficult courses through audio-visual techniques.

c) Teacher Training to primary school teachers

The program aims at capacity building among the primary school teachers of OIL's operational areas of Tinsukia and Dibrugarh and Charaideo districts of Upper Assam. The program focuses on enhancing the characteristics of the teachers, teacher behavior towards students affecting learning styles, learner achievement and learner motivation. The program seeks to build on the existing knowledge, skills and experiences of the teachers. The module is positioned as an in-service training requirement in order to re-orient teachers to their professional needs. Since the conceptualization of the programme in 2013-14, a total of 910 primary school teachers are trained till date.

d) Life Skills education in 75 schools

Under this program, two levels of life skill programs were delivered, they are Level I: based on sports and Level II: life anchor. Both these levels are based on 16 session module focusing on the girl students. The broad objective of the program is all round personality development of the students thereby helping them to become a good decision maker. The broad topics covered under the program were "Rapport Building", "Hygiene", "Environment", "Gender", "Financial



literacy" etc. The project is implemented in selected schools of OIL operational areas of Tinsukia, Dibrugarh & Charaideo districts. From FY 2019-20, life skill lessons are also imparted to the boys making it more inclusive.

Since FY 2014-15 till FY 2019-20, a total of 40,790 students of classes VII and VIII were given life skill lessons of which 10,613 students from 75 schools were imparted lessons in FY 2019-20.

e) Adding Dimension (Interactive Learning) program in 30 schools

Started in FY 2016-17, the intervention comprised of interactive learning which illustrated concepts from the curriculum, in English, Maths and Science to make learning real, interactive and fun. Adding Dimensions also aimed at improving creativity / thinking skills and sensitization in life skills though interventions focused on health & hygiene, self-expression, optical illusions, games, etc. which were implemented in 30 schools. The teachers are sensitized on



usage of the concepts illustrated through the physical infrastructure through training and capacity building initiatives. Thus, Adding Dimensions is an end to end solution aimed at a seamless integration of design and educational processes to impact learning outcomes.

The classrooms in 30 schools in OIL's operational area are designed with interesting teaching-learning aids to benefit 6,895 students in FY 2019-20. As a part of maintenance, in FY 2019-20, the old boards were replaced by new AD boards.

f) Distribution of Learning Kits in 30 schools

Started in 2016-17 fiscal, interactive learning kits on English, Science and Maths were distributed in 30 schools of OIL's operational areas of Upper Assam promoting activity based teaching & learning. The English relay program, Science kits and Math Master use the kit based approach (constructive approach) for building foundation skills in curricular subjects through games & activities, where learning happens through experimentation, trial & error and joyful experiences. In FY 2019-20, the program has covered 6,895 students of 30 schools.

g) Financial Literacy Program for Rural Community in 30 locations

Started in 2017-18, the Financial Literacy Program also popularly known as "Money Vidya", is a one-day training program targeting people in the rural areas in 24 locations of OIL's operational districts of Upper Assam. In order to impart the training, post school hours and post completion of the computer education sessions for students in schools, the computer buses are used as a mobile facilitation center for providing value added services to the Community for sensitizing



them on financial planning and adopting sound financial management practices. Newer components like kiosks by banking institutions for equipping the beneficiaries with 1st hand information on various financial decisions are also introduced.

Since FY 2017-18, 15,600 persons were imparted financial literacy under the programme including 6,000 persons in the financial year 2019-20.

h) Supplementary Education Program in 30 schools

Started in FY 2017-18, under this program, trained supplementary teachers in English, Maths and Science for classes VI to VIII were provided to 30 government schools in OIL's operational districts of Upper Assam. The program aimed at supporting the existing teaching staff of the schools by providing qualified teachers trained in theoretical and practical understanding of education, classroom management, subject pedagogy & evaluation. The program appreciated by schools,



benefitted 6,895 students of classes VI, VII and VIII in FY 2019-20. Since FY 2017-18 a total of 20,327 students are benefitted under the programme.

i) Read To Me[™] (RTM): Tech-enabled English Solution in 30 schools

The goal of *Read To Me* is to demonstrate that reading & comprehension technology when integrated with curriculum can make a material difference in literacy that can be scaled quickly and efficiently. Read To Me enables introduction of technology into the classrooms guided by the tenets of Minimum Change and Sustainability. Fluency, Vocabulary and Comprehension, Teach Helper $^{\text{TM}}$ are major component of the programme. The



programme started in FY 2019-20 is implemented amongst the students of 30 schools in OIL"s operational area.

j) Adult Education in 48 locations

Adult education classes are conducted in 36 locations targeting illiterate and semi-literate people of the rural and tea Garden areas. The course module is designed based on the Government of Assam approved textbooks of Sarva Shikshya Abhiyan. Apart from the regular course, sessions on other important issues like women empowerment, health, hygiene, sanitation, awareness on available Government Schemes, child rearing, etc. are also taught to the elderly participants. In FY 2019-20, 2,400 adults



were provided education classes from OIL's operational areas of Tinsukia, Dibrugarh and Charaideo districts. Since FY 2012-13 till FY 2019-20, 9,900 adults have been benefitted.







3. OIL Shikshya Ratna Puraskar: Started in 2013-14, the award recognizes all-round contribution of the teaching fraternity from provincialized schools and colleges from all over Assam. OIL Shikshya Ratna Puraskar has become one of the most prestigious awards conferred on the teaching fraternity in the presence of noted dignitaries like Governor of Assam, Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas, Govt. of India, Vice Chancellors of Universities, CMD, OIL, Functional Directors, and other senior OIL Indians. The financial incentive which was Rs. 1.00 lakh earlier is increased to Rs. 2.00 lakh from FY 2018-19. Alongside the cash incentive, a citation to each awardee presented on the occasion. The awardees are selected by a penal of eminent judges like reputed educationists, prominent literary personalities, government representatives from education board of Assam, education specialists from

state or national level bodies such as SCERT, NCERT, CBSE, etc based on certain parameters.

In *FY 2019-20, 04 (four) nos. of teachers* were awarded with *Shikhsya Ratna Puraskar* by Chairman & Managing Director, OIL in the presence of Functional Directors, OIL, Registrar, Dibrugarh University and senior officials of OIL. *Since 2013, so far, 38 teachers* have received the award. Teachers' workshop on contemporary and innovative teaching & learning practices is also organized with the award ceremony. Nearly 200 teachers attended the workshop in FY 2019-20.



4. OIL Merit Scholarships & OIL Awards: OIL Merit Scholarship Scheme and the OIL Awards (a special initiative) was instituted in the year 1997 and 2006 respectively to encourage meritorious students from OIL operational areas. The OIL Merit Scholarship Scheme awards merit-based scholarships to students passing class Xth and XIIth examinations under CBSE, ICSE, Assam State Boards and other State Boards where E&P activities are being carried out by OIL. On the other hand, the OIL Awards honors State rank- holders in HSLC & HSSLC from OIL operational areas of Assam. The award aims at motivating students to move ahead in life, achieve their goals, by doing well in their academics, and realizing their potential in various ways. This award and scholarship also aspires to create pool of young minds who would contribute towards the development of the nation as a whole.

The process for applying for the scholarship and award is online through a dedicated portal.

5. OTHER INITIATIVE UNDER EDUCATION

a) **Assistance to schools & colleges:** OIL provided financial assistance to various educational institutions towards enhancement of infrastructure & value of education in OIL's operational areas. This includes construction of Classrooms, library, playground, boundry walls, cycle stands, and distribution of computers to schools. Beside this, OIL sanctioned an amount of Rs. 14.26 lakhs to RKB Law College for infrastructural development (2019-20) and provided financial assistance of Rs. 25 lakh to All Morans Students' Union for development of education in their region.

b) Assistance towards Setting up of E-Learning facility at Directorate of Open and Distance Learning (DODL), Dibrugarh University: The main objective of DODL is to take Higher

Education to the doorsteps of the learners and impart excellent education. The target learners will not only be from the rural or interior areas of Upper Assam but also learners from other developing states in India. The E-Learning lab will conduct Vocational, Certificate, Diploma, UG & PG programs through an Electronic Learning Management System and usage of internet/CDs (if there is no internet connection) etc. Various courses like post graduate courses, certificate and diploma courses will be



offered in subjects like Assamese, English, Education, Sociology, Economics, Mathematics, Political Science and Commerce. With the introduction of E-Learning Lab, DODL will be able to provide full lectures online as well as offline for the aforesaid programs.

SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD -

Point No. (ii) as per schedule VII of Companies Act, 2013

1. Oil India Rural Development Society (OIRDS)

Instituted by Oil India Limited, Oil India Rural Development Society (OIRDS) was conceived with the principle objective to promote, undertake, carry out, sponsor, assist or aid directly or in any manner, any activity for the promotion and growth of rural economy and economic development and welfare or upliftment of the masses from rural areas/villages from the selected districts of OIL operational areas. OIRDS aims at sustainable growth pattern by the best possible utilization of the available resources, generating avenues for effective employment nurturing the existing skills of people by providing knowledge of science and technology, financial aid and other essential know-how.

Oil India Limited, the founder promoter of the society envisions equipping the rural societies with technological advancements which would further help integrating the less developed communities with the comparatively advanced mainstream. The activities of the Society have been running under the guidance of a Board of Directors constituted of Senior Officials of Oil India Limited, Agriculture experts from Assam Agriculture University and Local senior persons having interest in the field of agriculture.

OIRDS under the aegis of OIL India is engaged in two core areas namely- **the Agriculture Project** & **the Handicraft Training and Production Centre (HTPC)**.

a) Agriculture Project: started in 1991

Primary objective of Agriculture Project is to introduce modern methods of cultivation to generate large scale production and thus providing an opportunity to the unemployment youths of the society to adopt agriculture as a means of earning livelihood and attaining economic empowerment. While doing so, maximum emphasis is given in extending in-field training by experts from Agriculture Department, Government of Assam & Assam



Agriculture University for proper and adequate use of technology. To boost the encouragement of the farmers, OIRDS introduces high yielding paddy seeds specially collected from Regional Agriculture Research Centre, Titabor and organic manure to revitalize the paddy fields. The patterns of crops are mostly Sali & Rabi.

In FY 2019-20, 13 nos. of new villages were adopted under Sali cultivation covering 2,700 bighas and impacting 2,150 nos. of farm families. On the other hand, 14 nos. of villages were adopted under Rabi cultivation covering 1,230 bighas and impacting 2,290 nos. of farm families.

Since 1991-92 till 2019-20, OIRDS has adopted 162 villages under various farmers' collectives, covering around 25,237 farm families.

OIRDS in collaboration with Assam Agriculture University, Jorhat started a programme "Augmentation of Agriculture through Effective Resource Utilization with participatory approach", this is a three-year program with the objective to facilitate agriculture-centric livelihood and economic empowerment options benefitting the rural people of OIL's operational areas. Special emphasis is given on promoting "linkage model" wherein arable, pastoral and mixed type of farming are integrated for accruing maximum benefit to the farmers. The project is being implemented through workshops and specialized training modules on modern methods of agriculture/cultivation while also educating the beneficiary farmers about conservation of resources for increased and sustainable farm income. The project is being implemented in OIL's operational areas namely Kordoiguri (Khowang), Genichuk Hahorial Gaon (Rohmoria), Hathkola (Chabua), Amguri Nepali Gaon (Tingrai).

The selected beneficiaries from OIL's operational areas of Dibrugarh and Tinsukia districts are provided custom-designed training on the selected technologies by Assam Agriculture University. As per the DPR, the methodology of implementation is divided into three focused interventions namely:

I. Rice-Based Cropping System: At Khowang demonstration of HYV paddy was taken up amongst the farmers. This year, a new rice variety 'Shikon Dhan' was introduced in the project area. The farmers were highly impressed and benefitted with the performance of 'Shikon Dhan'. The area also cultivated Rabi crops immediately after the Sali season and eventually the area



was converted into double cropping area. Apart from these, 10 nos. of families were provided with livestock components like poultry rearing and piggery. On the occasion of Field Day, an Extension Bulletin was released on enhancing rice production through new HYV of paddy and circulated amongst the farmers.

- II. **Integrated Farming System:** This project is going on at Genichuk Hahorial Gaon, Rohmoria. The overall production from Kharif rice was much satisfactory. The farmers were also encouraged to take the second crop as they now are engaged in Rabi cultivation. In the livestock sector, the farmers are equipped with improved poultry birds like 'Vanraja' and 'Kalinga Brown' for egg production in addition to pig rearing.
- III. Organic Farming: At Hatkhola, Chabua a total area of 14 hectares has been covered under organic farming wherein 18 nos. of farmers are involved under the participatory approach. After a successful Kharif season the farm cultivated various Rabi crops like potato, chilli, cabbage, tomato, pumpkin etc. It may be noted that the farm has already been equipped with good infrastructure. A vermicompost production unit was set up during the FY 2018-19. The farm produces rice



varieties like Aghoni Bora, Keteki Joha, Black Rice, etc. which are in very high demand.

As a part of the "Augmentation of Agriculture through Efficient Resource Utilization with Participatory

Approach", a **Model Commercial Nursery** project was initiated by Oil India Rural Development Society (OIRDS), under the aegis of Oil India Limited and implemented with the technical support from Assam Agricultural University (AAU), Jorhat, Assam. With the help of modern infrastructure & technology, couple of 'mother blocks' for production of prominent horticultural crops has been made in the nursery. This modern nursery is equipped with production and maintenance of mother stocks for large-scale production of quality planting material, multiplication of elite clones and supply of



seedlings & planting materials to the customers. Presently sixteen (16) varieties of high yielding fruits and herbs & mediational plants are produced in the nursery.

b) Handicraft Training and Production Centre (HTPC): started in 1984

OIL's Handicraft Training and Production Centre, located at Duliajan, Assam has been imparting eleven-month stipendiary training in Weaving, Cutting, Tailoring & Embroidery to young girls/women from OIL operational areas. The students are selected through written test and vivavoce. Post training assistance in the form of looms, sewing machines, thread, etc. are provided to the women who successfully complete their training at HTPC. In FY 2019-20, 42 nos. of candidates were enrolled, out of which 16 nos. were selected for the Weaving trade while 26 were in Cutting/Tailoring & Embroidery for the eleven-month stipendiary training in Weaving, Cutting, Tailoring & Embroidery at the Centre.

A monthly stipend of Rs. 1500/- is given to the students along with post training assistance in the form of Fly Shuttle Handlooms along with Design Making Machines to the students who have completed their training in Weaving and USHA Sewing Machines to the students who have completed their training in Cutting, Tailoring & Embroidery Since, inception of the project more than 1,000 nos. of women from OIL's operational areas have been trained under the Centre. The course content of the trainings has been designed as per the recognized ITI syllabus of

Government of Assam in case of Knitting & Weaving and USHA syllabus is followed in case of Cutting & Embroidery.

As a part of the ongoing CSR Project under Oil India Rural Development Society (OIRDS), trainees of Handicraft Training & Production Centre (HTPC) were provided with post training assistance at

a ceremonious event held at Duliajan Club on 23rd August, 2019. Post training assistance like sewing machine, fly shuttle handloom sets and weaving & embroidery accessories along with certificate were distributed to 31 successfully passed out trainees for the year 2018-19 to encourage them for self-employment. Out of 31 trainees, 12 underwent training in weaving and 19 launched the new inclusive logo of HTPC.

2. Project OIL Rupantar: started in 2003:

OIL being a responsible corporate citizen deeply committed to socio-economic development in its areas of operation has collaborated with State Institute of Rural Development (SIRD) Assam, by signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on September 8th 2003, with a common goal to work towards the socio-economic development of people in the OIL's operational areas. The joint venture christened as Project "Rupantar" (meaning transformation) aspires to overcome unemployment in the areas, mainly among the youth by means of taking up entrepreneurship development programs (EDP), exploring self-employment opportunities in the primary, secondary and tertiary sectors. The project strengthening the rural economy focuses on assisting Self Help Groups/Joint Liability Groups for development of agro-based industries, diversification in handloom products with special focus on Eri and Muga (world famous golden silks of Assam), poultry farming, pig breeding, duck rearing, fishery, sericulture, organic farming, etc. along with a Computer Centre thereby help the unemployed youths to find alternate employment providing a scope for entrepreneurship. The marketing outlet 'AASTHA' at Duliajan has been satisfactorily providing the requisite support to the marketing needs of the SHGs of OIL's operational areas.

Since 2003, with infrastructural and other support from OIL, SIRD has formed around 8500 Self Help Groups (SHGs)/Joint Liability Groups (JLGs). However, since 2008, OIL has exclusively formed 3,542

SHGs/JLGs to which the company has extended 50% subsidy, other financial and material inputs. The groups were involved in self-employment ventures in order to economically support their respective households. The beneficiaries of the Project are mainly unemployed rural people, especially the farmers, women & youth with focus on Tea Garden areas. In FY 2019-20, a total of 325 JLGs were formed consisting of around 1,425 families who were involved in self-employment ventures enabling them to generate additional income to support their respective households.

Oil India Limited extended financial support to 350 Joint Liability Groups with a total project cost of Rs 6.68 Crore (Rupees Six Crore and Sixty Eight lakhs) at a disbursement function held at Rupantar Growth Centre, Tipling, Duliajan on 7th June, 2019. Implemented by project partner, State Institute of Panchayat and Rural Development (SIPRD), Assam, around 1495 families are extended support in FY 2018-19, out of which 625 nos. are female and 870 male beneficiaries.





Computer Centre: Since 2004, SIRD is successfully implementing a computer education program under OIL's Project Rupantar in Duliajan. The Computer centre offers various short-term courses (3-6 months) to students as well as other candidates at a subsidized rate of Rs 500.00 per month. In FY 2019-20, a total of around 700 students were trained in courses such as Basic, DTP, Web Page Designing, Tally, C Language, C++, Java, Linux, Visual Basic and Visual Basic Script.

3. **Project OIL Jeevika:** A flagship project of Oil India Ltd. inaugurated on 20th December 2016 and implemented by Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE), Guwahati, Project "OIL Jeevika" is NE India's 1st induced community-cluster based sustainable rural livelihood project. The project is currently being implemented in OIL's operational villages of Arunachal Pradesh in Diyun Circle (near Kumchai EPS), Changlang district namely, Kumchai Ka, Innao, Innao Chengmai, Innao Pathar and Piyong, benefitting 400 households. The project aims at providing backward & forward linkages to the targeted beneficiaries on two economic activities namely, (a) beekeeping & honey processing and (b) mustard, buckwheat & local pulses processing.

"OIL Jeevika" focusses on enhancing the production & marketing skills of the beneficiaries through robust in field training, exposure visits, scientific & material inputs while also focusing on value added production from honey, mustard, buckwheat and local pulses. The project aspires to generate additional source of income for the beneficiaries while forming self-sustaining livelihood clusters.



In FY 2019-20, OIL Jeevika started the 2nd phase of

implementation, wherein the primary focus is on implementation of hard interventions like equipping the clusters with a *Common Facility cum Business Centre (CFBIC)*, introduction of upgraded modern machineries and other services so as to boost the production of raw materials and processing of the same. Subsidiary focus has been also on training the beneficiaries for production of various value-added products and by-products. A plan of marketing the finished goods and their requisite certification cum licensing and *OIL* branding will also be a part of the project in future while also focusing on the convergence with the government marketing machineries.

Some major initiatives undertaken in FY 2020 were:

Training on Value Added & Diversified Products: A 15 days theoretical and practical training was held at IIE Guwahati Food Processing Incubation Centre. Visit to Baksa Bee Keeper and Agro Producer Company (FPO) at Vishnupura village of Baksa District of Assam and RRTC Meghalaya was organized for the participants for First hand exposure on production of Value Added and Diversified Products.

Distribution of Seeds for enhanced production: Mapping of land under Mustard, Buckwheat and local Pulses Seeds for surveying the land use pattern of the beneficiaries i.e., cultivated, uncultivated fallow land, total leased and unleased land, seed input required against per bigha of land for cultivation. 6,750 kgs of mustard seeds, buckwheat seeds and local pulses were distributed at an event held in Diyun to 150 nos. of active farmer beneficiaries.

Distribution of Additional Bee Boxes & Bee Colonies for enhanced production and display of value added products: An event was convened at Diyun Circle with the two primary objectives of (a) distributing bee boxes and colonies (12 bee boxes and 12 bee colonies to 100 beneficiaries each) and (b) Certificate distribution / Valedictory Function of the trainees under the training program on Value Addition and Other Diversified products.

SKILL & CAPACITY BUILDING-

Point No. (ii) as per schedule VII of Companies Act, 2013

1. Project OIL Swabalamban: started in 2013-14

OIL Swabalamban is placement linked skill & capacity building project leveraging on the demand for skilled manpower in various industrial and service sectors also in line with the Skill India programme of the Government. of India. The project aims at providing sustainable employment opportunities to the unemployed youths from OIL's operational areas through various industry relevant placements linked skill & capacity building programs. A number of short-term courses/trades are offered under the project like construction industry trades (plumbing, masonry, carpentry, welding, etc.) housekeeping & hospitality, food & beverages, sewing machine operator, electrician, BPO/Voice calling, general duty assistant, etc. certified by NSDC, Govt. of India.

Initially, the project was implemented in OIL's operational districts of Upper Assam namely, Tinsukia, Dibrugarh and Charaideo. Since last three years, the project has been extended/replicated in other districts of Assam like Sivasagar, Jorhat, Golaghat, Karbi-Anglong, Lakhimpur, Kamrup, Dhemaji, Udalguri, Baksa, Bongaigaon, Sonitpur, Majuli, Nagaon, Morigaon, Darrang, Barpeta, Chirang, Kokrajhar, Biswanath, Nalbari, Goalpara and Dhubri as well Namsai and Changlang districts of Arunachal Pradesh.

Since 2013-14, Project OIL Swabalamban had trained 18,117 and placed 14,220 candidates from various parts of Assam with maximum number of candidates from OIL's operational areas of Upper Assam. In FY 2019-20, the trades offered were Electrician, General Duty Assistant, Food & Beverage, Sewing Machine Operator, CRM Domestic Voice, Housekeeping and Hospitality, Fitter, Customer Care Executive, Automotive Service Technician, Radiology Technician and Refractionist.

2. General Nursing Midwifery (GNM) training: started in 1991

OIL Nursing School in OIL Hospital Duliajan conducts 03 years General Nursing Midwifery (GNM)

training course that is recognized by the Directorate of Medical Education, Government of Assam. Till FY 2017-18, the annual intake was 20 (Twenty) young women, out of which one vacancy each was reserved for SC and ST candidate. Stipend is paid to the students in addition to limited hostel accommodation, uniform and protective clothing. The target sector for post training employment is Government, semi-government and private. Since inception, more than 300 women have successfully completed the




training. Since, FY 2018-19, numbers of seats were raised thereby making it 30 new students who were given admissions and were trained under the 03-year course.

3. **Skill Development Institute (SDI), Guwahati:** Skill Development Institutes were set up by Oil & Gas PSU's to focus on imparting skill training to the youth. Oil India Limited had set up SDI at Guwahati in the year 2017 to cater to the Skilling needs of youth of the North East Region. SDI, Guwahati conducts ten placement linked Skill Training Courses i.e. (1) Industrial Electrician (Oil& Gas) (2) Industrial Welder (Oil & Gas) (3) Food & Beverages Service-Steward (4) Certificate course in Machine Operation (5) Certificate Course in CNC Turning (6) Arise Room Air Conditioner & Home Appliances (7) Certificate Course in Fitter & Rigger (8) Emergency Medical Technician (9) General Duty Assistant (10) Sewing Machine Operator.

Since 2017, the institute has trained nearly 1541 students, of which nearly 900 were trained in 2019-20.

Beside SDI, Guwahati, OIL also contributes financially towards SDIs set up by other Oil & Gas PSUs across the country.

DIFFERENTLY- ABLED (DIVYANGJAN)

1. Project OIL Sakshyam: The Project was initiated with the prime objective of catering to the needs of Mrinaljyoti Rehabilitation Centre (Duliajan) be it infrastructure development, running costs or any special project which will act as a support base for enabling students as productive and independent citizens of the mainstream. The annual grant of OIL in the last 4-5 years has enabled the Centre to provide the students with good living conditions, treatment/therapy/counselling, educational



facilities, transportation as well as extension of field-level services to newer areas. OIL believes that such gestures can be great moral boosters to these special children and for the society at large. Beside the annual financial grant, financial assistance towards construction of a shelter home for girls (one-time), procurement of a diesel generator set (one-time), development of playground, water filtration system, vocational training & livelihood under Project Parijat, transport facilities (procurement of Eco-Van), etc is also provided to the centre.

2. **Project Parijat:** In FY 2019-20, OIL under its CSR for empowering the differently abled students had started a noble as well as ambitious vocational project christened as Project "Parijat" in association with Mrinaljyoti Rehabilitation Centre (MRC), Duliajan and OIL Hospital. As part of the project under vocational education, the differently abled students of MRC at Duliajan are trained to produce garments for the newborn babies which are supplied by



MRC to OIL Hospital for presenting the kits to new born babies at the Hospital. The kit contains the 1st set of essential skin friendly babywear which are skillfully tailored by the students of MRC in the age group of 15-18 years who are no more part of any formal education system but have stayed with MRC. Every month around 45-50 nos. of kits are delivered to OIL Hospital. This provides meaningful & sustainable livelihood opportunities to the



students and helps them earn income thereby enabling socio-economic empowerment. The project aims at assimilating the differently abled students with the mainstream society while ensuring their continuous engagement in productive activities, which is one of the essentials for their positive mental health.

SUSTAINABLE ENVIRONMENT:

Point No. (iv) as per schedule VII of Companies Act, 2013

- 1) **Conservation of Hoolock Gibbon:** This project is OIL's seminal project on biodiversity conservation, especially conservation of endangered faunal species.
- Sasoni Merbeel Eco Tourism Project: Since inception of the project OIL has been supporting the initiative which has the potential of creating rural entrepreneurs apart from protecting the flora and fauna of the region. OIL has provided financial assistance for solar lighting, pedal boats and battery driver eco-friendly vehicles. A 40 kw Solar power plant has also been installed under OIL"s CSR initiative.
- 3) Adoption of Rhino calves: OIL has adopted 3 rhino calves for a period of three years which were orphaned by the devastating floods of 2016 in Kaziranga National Park. The Rhino calves were later rehabilitated at Manas National Park, Narshingbari, Assam.
- Contribution towards Pradhan Mantri Ujjawala Yojana (PMUY): Oil India Limited has contributes towards (PMUY) which aims at safeguarding the health of women and children by providing them with clean cooking fuel-LPG.



- Research Project for Preservation of White Winged Duck Asarcornis scutulata- the State Bird of **Assam in Digboi and surrounding areas":** The research study on "Present Status of White Winged Duck Asarcornis scutulata- the State Bird of Assam in Digboi and surrounding area" started in the month of May, 2019. The financial assistance was provided by OIL to Digboi College. Necessary equipment were purchased and field surveys were initiated in Oil Field areas and outside the core area of Soraipung Range under Digboi Forest Division. Extensive field surveys in Soraipung Range and Digboi Oil Field areas were carried out and till date 11 White Winged Ducks have been reported, photographed and video graphed from 10 locations in Soraipung area and 5 locations in oil field area.
- Distribution of Boats at Maguri Matapung Beel: Maguri-Motapung Beel is located 9km from Tinsukia town and just south of the Dibru-Saikhowa National Park. The beel, famous for migratory birds such as Pigeontailed jacana, Ruddy Shelduck, Yellow wagtails, Purple swamphens, Northern lapwing, Eurasian coot becomes a seasonal paradise for thousands of migratory birds in winter season attracting many tourists to these waterbodies which also gives an employment opportunity to local people, including women and unemployed youths. Under OIL-CSR



initiatives, OIL donated (Speed Boat - 01 no., Pedal boat - 02 nos., Small wooden boats - 04 nos.) which would boost the ecotourism in the region.

Preservation and Promotion of HERITAGE, ART & CULTURE:

Point No. (v) as per schedule VII of Companies Act, 2013

• Renovation and Preservation of Berry White Medical School in Dibrugarh: In FY 2017-18,

an MoU was signed between OIL and Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH), New Delhi in presence of Deputy Commissioner, Dibrugarh at DC Office on 10th January 2018 Heritage for Renovation & Restoration of Dr. John Berry White Medical School at Dibrugarh, Assam. Since then structural restoration which includes stitching of cracks & strengthening of structural members, repairing of roofing



system, repairing of damaged surfaces with original materials, replacing damaged woodworks in doors, windows, columns, truss etc. water proofing-seepage as well as capillary rise of water, landscaping etc. has been undertaken.

• OIL regularly contributes towards several events promoting and preserving local art, culture and heritage including dance, music, drama, theatre, art and craft etc of Assam.



Promotion of SPORTS with focus on Rural Sports:

Point No. (vii) as per schedule VII of Companies Act, 2013

OIL conducts rural sports in the OIL's operational villages to promote games and sports among

the youth and school students with prime focus on promotion of athletics. OIL's endeavor to promote rural sports was initiated in the year 2001 which provided a platform and encouraged the budding talents to participate at the village level and eventually represent at the district / state levels. There are several examples of young sports persons from villages of OIL's operational areas participating in such forums.



Rural Sports as a CSR initiative apart from providing a platform and motivating the budding talents from the rural parts of OIL's operational areas play the role of uniting the communities, mobilize, inspire and instill responsible behavior among the children and youth. OIL's contribution & collaboration with the social groups, district administration and sports bodies, has helped in making rural sports as one of the most popular sports event in the rural areas creating social advantage.



DEVELOPMENT OF INFRASTRUCTURE / SOCIAL ASSETS:

Point No. (x) as per schedule VII of Companies Act, 2013

The Company has been invested heavily in developing rural infrastructure to bring about all round development of the region. Over the years, under CSR the company has built over 2,500 kilometres of primarily rural roads to facilitate and improve basic communication. OIL has constructed many Public Stages, Auditoriums, Libraries, Lecture Halls, Computer Centres; roadside Waiting Sheds, upgraded & developed Rural Hospitals, Rural Schools & Institutes of higher education in various OIL operational districts of North East India.



CONTRIBUTION & SUPPORT TO GOVERNMENT INITIAITVES

- 1. **Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojna (PMUY):** Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana was launched by Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on May 1st, 2016. PMUY aims to safeguard the health of women & children by providing them with a clean cooking fuel LPG, so that they don't have to compromise their health in smoky kitchens or wander in unsafe areas collecting firewood. In order to support the Government in taking PMUY to the large section of the population, OIL has contributed nearly Rs 85 crores towards the scheme since its launch.
- Contribution towards Relief & Rehabilitation: Emergency situations like floods, Cyclones etc demands huge resources to reach out to the affected people. In order to facilitate Central & State Governments in their response to the natural disasters, contributions were made toward CM-RELIEF FUNDS of various states by OIL.
- 3. In order to strengthen India's fight against COVID 19 pandemic, OIL donated a sum of Rs. 13 Crores towards PMCARES Fund in FY 2019-20.



TRANSFORMATION OF ASPIRATIONAL DISTRICTS

Transformation of Aspirational Districts is a flagship initiative of the Government of India launched by Hon'ble Prime Minister wherein prime focus is being accorded to the role of CPSEs in bringing about visible changes in the districts through mobilization of their CSR funds and focus on thematic areas of development.
